Also, we have been working on identifying the beginning sounds of words. In additions we have been doing some rhyming work.


Through numerous activities students are working at identifying rhyming words. After being able to identify rhyming words, students will work towards producing rhyming words.


Grade 3- Language Arts

CLASSIOOM AND LANGUAGE AFTS UPDATE

For the month of January, students started with weekly spelling words and choice boards once again. This month we focused on suffixes, prefixes, and pronouns. Students also completed a New Years writing activity where they reflected and looked to the year ahead by making goals.

In writing students worked on their "Snow Monster Writing" which was how we created the play for our assembly performance on February 1. After reading "No Yeti Yeti" by Mary Ann Fraser students had to come up with their own idea of a snow monster. They then had to put their ideas into a short descriptive segment. Students were VERY creative with this writing!

Moving into February students will begin working towards understanding, and using the expository form of writing. Due to some shortened weeks, there will not be spelling words for some of the weeks in February.

Grade 4 Math update

This month students finished practicing and understanding basic and long division through teacher guided practice, partner activities, individual practice and technology. They demonstrated a strong understanding of long division and the steps in solving.

Next we will move onto fractions, decimals, and percent. Beginning with understanding fractions. Students will focus on using the correct vocabulary such as numerator, denominator, and whole.

Grade 4 Social Update

Students have just completed the first section of the unit "Alberta's Histories and Stories." This section was about the Indigenous groups of Alberta, which included culture, language, and oral storytelling. We have moved on the arrival of the Europeans which will cover the fur trade, voyageurs, settlements, and Francophone communities. As a class we have begun creating a timeline with all of the dates that come up in our readings. This timeline will come together by the end of this unit to show all of the changes Alberta and Canada experienced throughout the fur trade.

Language Arts 5/6 and Social 6 with Mrs. Allen

Language Arts 5/6

We have started a new book in grade 6, "Romeo and Juliet: Wishbone Version" which is a student friendly version of the classic by William Shakespeare. The students are enjoying this comedy/tragedy by reading aloud different roles from the dramatic play.

The grade 5s are over halfway through "The Mouse and the Motorcycle." Where is Keith's motorcycle? How are Keith and Ralph's relationship with one another after the motorcycle incident? How do Ralph's family feel about relying on Keith to bring them their food now that they have to lie low?

Both classes are currently doing prefixes in spelling. What does the prefix im- do to the base word? What about the prefix un-? The prefix re-? We will be doing more Empowering Writers booklets this year, in this month we are focusing on strong beginnings (hooks) to get the reader to want to read more!

Social 6

The students are writing their ch. 5 quiz on local government today, and we will start Ancient Athens Democracy next week. Ancient Athens is described as a direct democracy. Do you know what that means? (Canada is a representative democracy).

Math 6, Science 6, and Art/Music 5/6 with Miss Bablitz

Math 6

We finished up our fractions unit where students developed an understanding of adding, subtracting and multiplying fractions. Grade 6 students have just started looking at Rations, Unit Rates & Percent. This will be a quick unit and then we will be moving onto Integers.

Science 6

Students just completed their introduction to the Sky Science unit mural project. It turned out so great and the kids had a great time completing it. We looked closely at characteristics of each planet in our solar system, how they are divided, how they orbit and the contribution of stars in our solar system.

Art %

Students have completed their graffiti art as well as a New Years art project using recycled paper and pastels. We also completed a black out poetry project and students are currently working on a Famous Artist Research Project.

Mrs. Hill - Grade 7



January was a month jam packed with variety. Back to school after a wonderful Christmas Break and Ms. Suitor moves to Gr.1 so Mrs. Hill covers grade 7. Three days in and the thermometer plummeted so we ended up with no buses running. Week 2 was only 4 days long so we worked hard to dive into the January curriculum. Then, during week 3 and we headed off to Grasmere School for round 2 of CTF options. These kids made Rich Valley School with their mature and friendly behaviour. As far as the core subjects are concerned:

In **Math**, we've focused on the circumference, radius and diameter of circles. Real life story problems have been tackled to show why we use the formulas in our everyday life. In **LA**, we've begun a Novel Study called *Locked in Time* and are working through this suspenseful story as a group. We are aware of all the foreshadowing and are making predictions of what is yet to come.

In **Science**, we are working through the final section of the Planet Earth Unit. After learning about tectonic plates and how mountains were created, we've turned our focus to fossils and the Geologic Time Scale. The kids are working on a great slideshow project that is going to be lots of educational fun for them.

In **Social**, our work has focused on the conflict between the French and British in Europe and in North America in the mid 1700s, especially the Battle on the Plains of Abraham and the end of The 7 Years War. The role of the 1st Nations in these conflicts have given us a 3rd perspective to the growth of our nation.

And finally, **Mrs. Benn** is returning from her maternity on Feb. 1st and will take this great group of kids through to the end of June, preparing them for next year at OJSHS. I will be returning to my retirement, substituting when needed and coaching the basketball teams, preparing them for the tournament on March 9. I move on with a happy heart.

Grade 3s & 5s



Happy New Year! It's great to be back at RVS! Mrs. Hill started the year off strong with the Grade 3s and 5s, and I'm looking forward to keeping it rolling with this amazing group of students!

Grade 3 Math

We have continued to practice multiplication, and everyone seems to have a great understanding of it so far! We have also been working on the measurement unit. Students have been learning all about the metric and standard systems of measurement.

Grade 3 Science

We have started off the year with the Forces unit. In this unit, students learn about the contact and non-contact forces such as tension, friction, and gravity. Last week, we built catapults in order to see spring force in action!

Grade 3 Social

The Grade 3s are now learning about Ukraine. So far, we have looked at the geography and history of Ukraine, and will now be exploring Ukrainian culture.

Grade 5 Math

The Grade 5s have started working on fractions. We have begun with a review of naming and comparing fractions with a common denominator. Next, students will be introduced to the idea of improper fractions and mixed numbers.
