

Literacy

In literacy, the kindergarten students have had a very busy month. This month they learned the letters J, K and F. Students also spent some time reviewing previously learned letters. In addition, students practiced printing words and completing a couple of listen and draws (mystery pictures). The class has been continuing to work on letter/sound production, beginning sounds and rhyming. In the near future, the students will also begin learning some sight words. These concepts are being taught in a variety of ways. Listening to stories/songs, reading, playing games, sharing, crafts and worksheets are all a part of the learning process.

Numeracy

In numeracy, we have been reviewing numbers studied thus far (1-6). This includes being able to recognize the numeral, counting objects and familiarity with ten frames, number lines and tally marks.

Other

Earlier this month, kindergarten participated in the school wide Winter Fun Day It was a beautiful day of outside games, cookies and hot cocoa!

Language Arts

Students are learning about the structure of a story (characters, setting, problem), as well as identifying the beginning, middle and end of a story. We have been working hard on our printing in class, and are continuing to work on using our tool sounds and sight words to guide us in writing independently.

Social

In Social Studies, we have continued to discuss community and how our actions and decisions contribute to the well-being of groups, and natural environment of our community.

Math

The Grade Ones are continuing to work on developing strategies to solve addition and subtraction math problems. Lately, we have been working with part-part whole triangles and fact families to guide us in our thinking. Number lines, manipulatives, doubles/mental math, and fact family triangles are just some of the strategies we can use!

Science

In science the Grade Ones are learning about living and nonliving things. We examine the needs of plants and animals and talk about their similarities and differences!


In writing we have been working on lengthening our pieces. The students continue to use the same writing format they were introduced to at the beginning of the year, however, within each idea, they need to have a minimum of 3 detailed sentences. The students are shocked at how much they can write! The Grade 2 students practiced using the dictionary when learning about "th" in Sound City. They had to work with a partner to find 5 words with "th" in

them.

The focus in math this week has been around measurement as this is our new unit. They have learned non-standard units (i.e. blocks or paper clips), estimating, and how to use those units to measure a variety of items. In the coming weeks, the students will be getting into learning about standard measurement.

Over the coarse of the past 2 months, the students have been learning about Pop Art. They have

learned about the artists Any Warhol and Jim Dine and had the opportunity to create their own version of Pop Art.

GRADE 3- CHARLOTTE'S WEB AND CURSIVE

This month the Grade 3 students have been working through the novel "Charlotte's Web." They read the assigned chapters in a couple of different ways: with a partner, independently, or listen to it being read as they follow along. We are

nearing the end of the novel. Once Charlotte's Web is completed, the students will do a project based around their favourite chapter.

The students have also been working on their cursive writing. They are learning 2 new letters per week. Once they

have practiced the new letters using a whiteboard strip and feel confident, they complete the correlating letter sheet. The students are showing some impressive cursive writing skills!





Grade 4/5 classroom news

CLASSIOOM AND LANGUAGE AFTS UPDATE

For the month of March students learned about how to write a newspaper article. They looked at the structure and elements of a newspaper article which included a headline, a lead or hook, the 5 W's (who, what, where, when, why), the body paragraphs, and a conclusion. Then they were challenged to write their own article about a Leprechaun causing chaos at Rich Valley. Students had to come up with their own description of a Leprechaun, and get creative with ways to catch it. They even had the opportunity to interview Mr. Peterson about the situation so that they could use quote in their articles.

They started their book club style novel study this month. They are in different groups reading different novels. The novels are: Mice at Centre Ice, Socks, Boxcar Children, and Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing. They are working well in their groups by reading, answering questions, and working on various activities.

After Spring Break spelling will start again, and students will begin planning another piece of narrative writing.

Grade 4 Math update

This month students started working with decimals. They learned that fractions can be converted into decimals as long as the numerator is 10 or 100. Students used their ability to find equivalent fractions to change denominators, and then convert the fractions into decimals. Students worked hard at using proper terminology, and made the connections between decimals and money. After wrapping up with decimals students moved onto percent, which required them to us their knowledge of fractions, decimals, multiplication, and division. They showed a good understanding of percent. After Spring Break we will move onto Patterns and Equations.

Grade 4 Social update

The grade 4's have been learning about the Fur Trade and the first settlements across Alberta. They completed a piece of writing on Voyageurs, and then went onto to learn about French settlements in Alberta. They created a postcard about a small town or community in Alberta that was initially settled by the French. Students did a wonderful job on their postcards! They then moved onto learning about the Metis. Students learned about history, culture, and language of the Metis people. They are currently creating posters that showcase their knowledge about and understanding of the Metis.





Language Arts 5/6 and Social 6 with Mrs. Allen

Language Arts

The grade 6s have finished their novel "The Breadwinner," and are enjoying watching the animated movie these past 2 days before spring break. When we return, we will likely do a research project about various human-made structures of the land, and how meaning is conveyed through these structures.

After spring break, we will move onto homophones in spelling. Why is it important to know how to spell different words that sound the same, but have different meanings, correctly? When would it be important to know this skill in real life?

In writing, we have moved onto building suspense by using word referents (clues that are adjectives or nouns). The class is creating slideshows by themselves and with a partner as well.

Social 6

The students will write their Iroquois Confederacy quiz when we return from spring break. What was the Great Law of Peace? Who were the 6 nations? What kind of decision making did the Iroquois use compared to our Canadian government, as well as compared to Ancient Athens? What role did women have in Iroquois society vs. Ancient Athens?

Math 6, Science 6, and Art/Music 5/6 with Miss Bablitz

Math 6

In Math we completed our Integers unit where students compared, and added integers. After spring break we will be moving into Algebra. Over spring break I encourage you to continue to work with your child practicing their basic facts.

Science 6

We have continued to work through the Sky Science Unit. Students presented their constellation projects and they all did great! We will be looking at moon phases and sun dials after spring break!

Art/ Music %

Students who sent in their addresses for their virtual "hugs" were sent out to the people of their choice! We completed our Traditional Ukrainian Easter Egg Decorating (Pysanky) for Easter just before break! Students also got a chance to learn the recorder with Mrs. Allen.





Language/Social

This past month has been jammed pack with new material and content. In Language Arts we have been working on our Locked in Time novel. We finally finished reading and are now working on our final projects. The students are creating comics, brochures, posters, and written responses to showcase their understanding of the novel. We have also begun learning about poetry and figurative language.

During social, we have been working on the crucial events that led to Canadian Confederation. The students have been participating in class discussions, along with individual reading and research.

Math/Science

Grade 3s & 5s

Grade 3 Math

The Grade 3s have just finished their fractions unit, where they learned how to name and model different fractions, as well as compare fractions with the same and different denominators. They continue to practice their basic multiplication facts, and the algorithms for addition and subtraction of multi-digit numbers

Grade 3 Science

In Science the Grade 3s have continued to learn about forces and simple machines. So far, we have learned about the wheel and axle, inclined plane, and the wedge, and explored how these machines are used in our everyday lives, and how they increase or change the direction of a force to make work easier.

Grade 3 Social

In Social, we have finished the Ukraine unit! We will wrap up the unit with a Ukrainian feast and dance on Friday to lead us into our break!

Grade 5 Math

Do you know how to calculate the area of a rectangle? The Grade 5s do! They have spent the last week measuring and calculating the perimeters and areas of rectangles. Prior to that, they were learning all about fractions. This year, they learned to add and subtract fractions with the same denominator, and convert mixed numbers to improper fractions and vice versa. On Friday they will be converting some mixed up measurements in order to correctly interpret a recipe!
