Literacy & Math

In Literacy this month, the kindergarten class almost finished up learning about the last few letters of the alphabet! The final few letters to be studied are Q and Z. For the remainder of the year the class will continue to practice naming the letters and identifying the corresponding letter sound. These skills will be practiced and reviewed in a variety of ways, such as classroom games, online games, stories, pictures, puzzles, etc.

This month, we also learned a few more sight words. Students will continue to learn some more sight words to better prepare them for

grade one!

In June, students will also start to listen for syllables in words Students should be able to clap their name and tell how many syllables they have. This skill will be continued to work on and expanded into recognizing syllables in other words.

The kindergarten class is also working on producing words in a word family. So if the family is at, they can produce and read words such as mat, cat, sat, etc. We will continue with other word families in the month of June.

In Math, we are still

working on counting objects to ten (some beyond), identifying numerals to ten, and subitizing. The students count to 20 on a daily basis and also practice counting backwards from various starting points. They also practice saying/reading their phone numbers on a daily basis. Some students have now memorized their phone numbers and can recite them when asked.

For the month of June, kindergarten will be working on a small shapes and measurement unit as well as, reviewing all aspects of numbers to ten.

Language Arts/ Daily 5

The grade one's are working on writing multiple sentences using conjunction words. They are provided a sentence starter and create their own sentence using the sight words and personal dictionaries. We have also been learning about how we can use our 5 main senses to add detail within our writing!

We just wrapped up our Geometry Unit as well, learning the names of 3-Dimensional shapes, we also discussed the symmetry of shapes. Language Arts, Math, and Science

This month in Language Arts, both the Grade 2s and the Grade 3s completed their final fairytale story. They used the given template to create the written portion and then worked on completing illustrations to go with it. During the month of May, the students used the Visualizing and Verbalizing program to help them generate images in their mind. Being able to do so allowed the students to write more creatively and explain what they envision in their heads. This program worked very well and the students continue to use it with any additional writing activities that pop

This month in Grade 2 math, they completed their unit on measurement and time. During the last couple of weeks, the students have been revisiting adding and subtracting 2digit numbers. The students have been exposed to a variety of methods in which they choose which one they feel the most comfortable with. It has shown that the students are continuing to find subtraction more difficult when looking for whether they need to borrow or not.

In Grade 2 Science, the students worked on their Earth Science unit. They are finishing up the unit by creating a diorama of the Earth's landforms.

<u>CLASSTOOM AND LANGUAGE AITS UPDATE</u>

For the month of May students focused on writing. They completed their final piece of narrative writing for the school year. For this writing students had to first fully develop a character before starting their story planning. This fully developed character must be in their story, and the story must have a element of magic. Students came up with some interesting and exciting ideas for their stories, and worked hard to bring them to life.

They have also worked on poetry and figurative language. They covered Haiku, Cinquain, and Acrostic poems so far. Next up will be simile, metaphor, and alliteration. All of their poems will be made into a personal poetry book.

To finish the school year, students will complete a short unit on different forms of stories such as myths, legends, folk tales, tall tales and Indigenous Storytelling.

Grade 4 Math update

This month students worked on Telling Time and Geometry. This included telling time to nearest half hour, 15 minutes, 5 minutes, and minute. Students also calculated elapsed time, and examined hours, minutes and seconds.

In geometry they have covered polygones, angles, and triangles. They will also cover transformations and 3-D shapes.

After geometry students will move onto their last math unit of the school year which is measurement. Measurement will include standard units of measurement, and area.

The students are enjoying our poetry unit, as we have covered Alliterations, Terse Verse, and Name poems. Next up will be Haiku and Tanka, Paint poetry, and cinquain and diamonte. The students are turning these poems into a Google Slideshow that we can present in class.

We will continue doing our spelling words and Raz-kids each week until the end of the year. The grade 6s will also start practicing released PAT reading comprehension tests to prepare them for their field test the week of June 10-14.

Great job on the Read-a-Thon everyone! I was so pleased to see so many students reading more than ever before! Even after the Read-a-Thon, I hope to see students continue reading each night.

Social 6

We are on our last chapter of the year: Chapter 8: Voices for Change. After we are done with this chapter, we will start studying for the Provincial Achievement Test (PAT) which will take place on Wednesday, June 19th. Look for possible study materials to be sent home over the next weeks in June leading up to the PAT.

Math 6

In Math we completed our Patterns & Relations Unit test. The kids should have brought it home today! We are moving into our last unit, which is Geometry. Students will be plotting, analyzing, translating and reflecting shapes and coordinates on a cartesian plane. Students have also been doing review to help them prepare for the PAT Field test that is the week of June 10-14.

Science 6

The students got lots of hands-on experience at the Telus World Of Science and after we had our Evidence and Investigation Unit test. We are now in our last unit - Trees & Forest. We will work through that and then prepare for the Science PAT test that is scheduled for Thursday June 20. Students will be receiving study packages to prepare for this!

Art %

Students just completed a project on one point perspective imaginary rooms. They are now working on a landscape project where they have to use paper materials to recreate the landscape.







Grade 7 News

Language Arts

The month of May has come and gone in a flash. With only one month left, we have been focusing on essay writing, along with continuing our work on flow and unity of writing. The Grade 7's are currently writing an expository essay where they have selected a topic of their choice and are into the researching, and information collection phases. We will soon put it all together to create a unified piece of writing.

Math/Science

In math this month, we worked on a data analysis unit. The grade 7's were finding mean, mode, medium and range from collected and given date. They also experimented with probability and sample space. Into our final unit, we will be discussing geometry. They will learn how to plot points into all four quadrants as well as angle bisectors and parallel lines.

As for science, we are right in the middle of our final unit, Plants for Food and Fibre. The students have been researching plant adaptations, participating in jam boards about the roles of plants, and will soon be planting Cosmo's to watch and observe germination.

Social

During the last few weeks, we have been focusing on Louis Riel and his controversial impact on Canadian History. This also allowed us to analyze The Manitoba Act and The Manitoba School Act.







Mrs. Wild's Grade 3s & 5s

The Telus World of Science field trip was a blast! The Grade 3 class explored the dinosaur exhibit, watched an IMAX 3D movie about butterflies and a Zeidler Dome presentation about constellations, and built roller coasters!



Grade 3 Math

The Grade 3 class has been learning different strategies to slide (translate), flip (reflect), and turn (rotate) shapes. This requires spatial visualization which comes easily to some students, but others find challenging!

Grade 3 Science

In Science, the Grade 3s have learned all about the plates of the Earth, and what landforms and events occur due to plate interaction. They have also been learning about fossil formation and what this teaches us about our planet's history.

Grade 3 Social

In Social, the Grade 3s continue to learn about the country of India. They have learned about important figures from India's history, and about the different seasons that India experiences. Did you know that India does not experience spring, summer, fall, and winter in the same way as we do in Canada? See if your child can remember the three main seasons in India!

Grade 5 Math

The Grade 5s have completed the algebra unit. and should now be able to solve multi-step expressions by following the correct order of operations (B/P-E-D-M-A-S), and to express multiplication and division of a variable as a single coefficient. They are now learning about symmetry and finding examples of it in the world around us.
