Literacy & Numeracy

Wow...where has the month gone! During this short amount of time, we finished the letter J, K and are starting the letter F. The class will also using their letter knowledge to build, read and spell some short words. Some of the words they will be learning are mom, dad, pop, pup, ax, etc. We will continue to build on this throughout the year, as we add new letters.

Also, we have been working on identifying the beginning sounds of words. In additions we have been doing some rhyming work.
Through numerous activities students are working at identifying rhyming words. After being able to identify rhyming words, students will work towards producing rhyming words.

In numeracy, the class has now studied up to (including) the number four. Students should be able to identify and subitize (recognize an amount at a glance) up to three. We will continue to practice this as we continue our number study. A great way you can practice at home is by letting your child count various things. Can you count out 5 cheerios? Or how many apples are in the bowl?

Language Arts

In LA we have been reading many different stories and discussing the different story elements (characters, setting, problem etc..). The students love to predict what will happen next after each page and check if they were right! We have also been talking about the beginning, middle, and ending of each story. A lot of our writing will be focused around beginning, middle, end (or first, next, last).

Science

We are beginning our Climate and Weather Unit! We will be discussing the seasons and how they impact daily human life (clothing, events etc), as well as different animals (migration/Hibernation).

Social Studies

Students are continuing to exploring what community is and are learning how they can help their community and environment.

Math

Our Financial Literacy Unit was a great success! We have no moved onto our next concept of adding and subtracting. We continue to talk about money, and identify coins using a fun poster coin system by our doorway!

We are continuing our counting routine every morning using our days in school chart! The students are slowly learning how to count continue to count by 1's, 2's, 5's, 10's, and backwards by 1's every day. We also continue to break down the place value of various numbers (tens and ones). The grade ones are exploring the idea of addition and are slowly being introduced to different strategies when adding. We are going to work on making 10, as well as doubles to develop our basic number sense.





Grade 2 News

Language Arts, Social Studies, and Science

This month in Lanquage Arts, the students have been working hard on their writing. We have been adjusting focus based on their 20-minute writes and what areas need improvement all the while adding in outcomes that are to be covered. The Grade 2 students are getting better with implementing Visualizing and Verbalizing process into their writing along with re-reading their work to make sure that each sentence has the necessary elements. The

current writing piece that they are working on is based around being stuck in a snow globe and the activities they would do to keep them busy. They will soon be up on the bulletin board for all to read!

This month in Social Studies, the Grade 2 students have been learning about the community of Iqaluit and making connections to their own community. They learned about the Inuit and the different forms of shelter based on the time

of year. They had the opportunity to make an igloo using a bowl, marshmallows, and glue.

In Science, the students are learning about energy through movement and sound.





CLASSIOOM AND LANGUAGE AFTS UPDATE

For the month of January, students started with weekly spelling words and checklists once again. This month we focused on suffixes, and prefixes. Students also completed a New Years writing activity where they reflected, and looked to the year ahead by making goals.

In writing students worked on their "Mitten Writing" which started with the class reading the story "The Mitten", where forest animals all try to stay warm in a lost mitten. Students had to research an animal to write about. In their writing they had to give details about their animal WITHOUT telling what type of animal it was. The grade 4's did a wonderful job presenting their writing at the assembly.

Students also started learning about the expository form of writing. In February they will research a topic to write about, and create their own 3 paragraph piece of expository writing. They are already excited about the research process.

Grade 4 Math update

This month students finished practicing and understanding basic and long division through teacher guided practice, partner activities, individual practice and technology. They demonstrated an understanding of long division and the steps of divide, multiply, subtract, bring down, and repeat when solving a long division equation. While this can be a very complicated process, students showed willingness and success.

Next we will move onto a very short unit about Prime and Composite numbers before moving onto fractions and decimals later on in February.

Grade 4 Science update

After Christmas Break students completed the unit "Energy: Non-Contact Forces", and moved onto "Space". This unit involves learning about outer space including the planets in our solar system, moons, the sun, telescopes, galaxies, and constellations.

Students are very engaged in this unit, and have many interesting questions that we hope to find the answers to! They worked together as a class to create a poster of the solar system to be displayed in our classroom. Students are very excited to continue this unit and learn all they can about outer space!



Language Arts

This past month during Language Arts we have been focusing on reading fluency, character perspective and figurative language. We also continued to work on editing our own work and adding appropriate punctuation, some challenging themselves with semicolons. Looking back at their own writing with the purpose of identifying mistakes can be a very difficult skill but something we will continue to work on. The grade 7's will soon start their first novel and film study!

Science

We have just wrapped up our Planet Earth Unit. We are finishing up the unit with a Geologic Time Scale Project. The students have picked an era and are researching the different landforms and organisms that were present during this time. Our next unit is called Heat & Temperature.

Math
